"What if I told you God is doing more than we can see?"

For many years, these words have been my go-to. In times of challenge, they have been a comfort. In times of trial, they have brought strength and encouragement. In times of change, they have carried me with a thrill of anticipation, as if God were saying "hold on Andrea. This is gonna be epic." Just writing this I get all kinds of excited thinking about how God is doing way, way, way more than we can see.

But. Let's be honest. The same words that bring comfort, encouragement and the thrill of anticipation also stir up anxiety, worry, uncertainty and even moments of full on doubt: "Really, God? Really?" What tension it is to believe God is doing more than we can see, and then, you know, walk by faith and trust it! Why am I sharing this with you? Well, what if I told you God is doing more than we can see?

In the 3 years since I first visited with the call team, one thing has been clear: God is doing more than we can see. Through ups and downs, challenges and changes, bold steps of faith and intentional patience.

God has been faithful. As our leadership has prayerfully discerned, God has been faithful. As we've stood at crossroads, wrestled with next steps, learned lessons, admitted mistakes and sought to grow, you guessed it. God has been faithful.

But how do we know? Well, we begin to see. We see God bringing clarity and a united sense of who we are and what we are called to do. We see God pruning (ouch) and grafting in (wow). We see God taking us deeper into his word, deeper into his presence, deeper than our feet can wander. We begin to see—again and



as always — that God can't be anything but faithful. **It's who he is.**

In the pages ahead, you'll notice a new format and intentional changes. We've heard your comments and suggestions and learned some good lessons. We continue to assess how information is shared and what our church family might need so they know they are vital members of our faith community. We'll do more tweaking in the months ahead, but our prayer is that the information and content in this newsletter will encourage you in faith and equip you as brothers and sisters in Christ.

As I see what is happening in kids and teen ministries, worship with you on Sundays and Wednesdays, engage in conversation about HLS/HLC, visit with our ministry teams and engage with RiseUp, I am brought to my knees in worship. God is doing more than we can see. The year ahead will be full, exciting, messy, hopeful, uncertain. But this I know: **God is faithful.**




BIRTHDAY BASH

We are thankful for the ongoing support and patience of the congregation as we continue to assess our existing teams and attend to the needs of our congregation.

GREETINGS FROM THE PERSONNEL TEAM!

We recognize that some congregation members may not know about or understand what the role of this team is. This team is comprised of 4 members chosen by the HLC Vision Council, with no term limits. We are essentially the HR department for the church. Our team is responsible for determining non-clergy staffing needs for HLC. We modify job descriptions, post positions, vet applicants, complete interviews and present hiring recommendations to the Vision Council. We work in conjunction with the Lead Pastor

to complete annual employee reviews. We also determine salary adjustments for all HLC employees, bringing our recommendations to the Vision Council for approval. Over the course of the last couple of years we have, in conjunction with Pastor Andrea, attended to the changing needs of HLC. We typically meet once per month, but often it is more frequent when needed. If a congregation member attended one of our meetings they may not understand how we come to an agreement, but our process works.

(There is ALWAYS a lot of talking, laughing and excitement.) Each member of our team has a different point of view, brings a different perspective and can articulate their thoughts and ideas. There are meetings where we dialogue and then dispatch to intentionally pray for clarification and direction. When we reconvene we typically have come to a unified, working solution that is mutually agreed upon. We are compassionate individuals and dedicated congregation members, who believe in the vision and mission of HLC. We know and can bear witness that God is doing more than we can see or imagine, and that He has a plan for HLC. We ask all Hawley Lutheran members to pray for the Personnel Team as we continue to do the work for the betterment of our church and to show the love of Jesus to all who enter Hawley Lutheran Church. The current HLC Personnel Team consists of Jana Fischer, Katie Lowry, Nelaina Daggett, and Phil Stahl.

We have had a few challenges in 2022, with a sewer back up, leaking roof, ongoing HVAC challenges and the sanctuary air handler. We feel the pressure of our aging building and are trying to strike a balance of responsible repairs vs. exploring new options. We continue to work with staff on tree trimming, lawn maintenance and snow removal. We have explored the removal of the green house that was purchased to make way for the expanded parking lot proposed under the RiseUp Team's plan. WHAT'S NEXT FOR HLC/HLS?

In December, HLS staff will move into HLC. Our building will serve as office and ministry space for Pastor Micah and Becky. RISEUP TEAM UPDATE

We are so excited about our recent congregational vote to support the start of a \$5.4 million dollar capital campaign as recommended by our RiseUp team. As you know, HLC has many property needs that must be attended to, including repairing our roof and heating and cooling systems. But more than required property maintenance and asset management, we are excited to enhance our ministry opportunities for the purpose of our mission of growing in faith and serving the Lord-Know, Grow, Go. We have been prayerful on answering, how can we better serve our community and congregational member needs?

NEXT STEPS

The RiseUp Team will now begin building a Capital Campaign Team to better support these efforts. The vote held October 12 determined that we would raise \$2 million dollars before reengaging with our architect for additional design and construction documents.

Once this benchmark is reached, we will come back to the congregation for additional feedback, further needs assessments and exciting design work. In the meantime, pray for this team and pray for ways we can serve and give towards these efforts. Reach out to the RiseUp Team member to get involved, offer ideas, suggestions and solutions.

Hawley Lutheran Church is growing and God is moving. God is leading us into a new season of ministry. This is an exciting time. On behalf of the RiseUp Team, we thank you for your support and patience with us in this intentional and prayerful process. APPROVAL OF AGENDA Cindy Byklum made motion to approve the October agenda. Seconded by Mark Redepenning. Motion passed. **APPROVAL OF SEPTEMBER MINUTES:** Tiffany Fossen made motion to approve the September minutes. Seconded by Gerry Kluck. Motion passed.

OPEN FORUM/GUEST: Pastor Darwin Stahl - Pastor Darwin came to council with data he collected on the needs for what pastoral care looks like for HLC. He also stressed the need to "Keep the Hawley grapevine line of communication open".

FINANCE REPORT: Josh Prososki

- Revenue for the month of September was \$20,166.05; Monthly Expenses=\$27,617.58; Net=-7,451.53; Checking balance as of 9/20/2022=\$98,646.58;
- FTV balance=\$78,735.33; Memorials balance=\$92,147.27; Loan=\$111,550.00 YTD Revenue=\$238,270.82; YTD Expenses=\$249,468.27; YTD Net=-\$11,197.45.
- Still working on checkbook consolidation of accounts, making progress.
- Josh will be putting a claim into the insurance company for water damage done in the basement of the church.

OLD BUSINESS

RiseUp Team Update: Met and discussed the congregational vote, and recommendations on capital campaign discussion. They received a lot of positive feedback, and energetic responses from congregation members. They are hoping to roll out a timeline soon.

Property Team Update: Green House Update; property received 2 bids for demolition of the property, with Sellin Bros. Inc. coming in with the most cost effective bid. On behalf of the RiseUp Team, Gerry Kluck made a motion to demolish the property of 702 Hartford Street per Sellin Brothers bid. Tori Leister seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Christian Education Update: Discussion on all of the positive things happening with the HLC kids.

Audit Team Update: The audit team will be meeting November 28th 2022 for the audit of November 2021-October 2022

Worship Team: The worship team had a discussion on the overwhelming growth of Wednesday worship, (YAY GOD!) looking at the possibility of adding a second contemporary service on Sunday's, starting in the fall of 2023.

Nominating Committee: With the Annual Meeting just around the corner, it is time to start planting seeds to the congregation about the joy of not only serving God, but also what it means to serve our church.
